# Clarinet Jury Requirements Last revised September 2025

#### Year 1 M1140, M1925

Repertoire should be selected from standard clarinet literature in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. Two or three pieces should be selected to contrast in style and must amount to a total playing time not less than 15 minutes. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries but an etude may be used.

#### M1920 Year 1

In consultation with the studio teacher, students must prepare 3 pieces of repertoire - at least one piece from the following list of required works (or similar-level substitution permitted by the instructor) and the others may be selected from standard clarinet literature. A work by an under-represented composer is strongly encouraged. All selected repertoire must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes.

Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations from weekly lessons and studio classes will take place both mid-term and late second term before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark.

#### M2925 Year 2

Repertoire should be selected from standard clarinet literature in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. Two or three pieces should be selected to contrast in style and must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries.

#### **Year 2** M2920, 2921, 2922

In consultation with the studio teacher, students must prepare 3 pieces of repertoire - at least one piece from the following list of required works (or similar-level substitution permitted by the instructor) and the others may be selected from standard clarinet solo literature. A work by an under-represented composer is strongly encouraged. All selected repertoire must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes.

Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations from weekly lessons and studio classes will take place both mid-term and late second term before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark.

#### Year 3 M3925

Repertoire should be selected from standard clarinet literature in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. Two or three pieces should be selected to contrast in style and must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

# **Year 3** M3924y, M3929

Repertoire should be selected from standard clarinet literature in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. All selected repertoire must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes (for M3924y 15 minutes). Technique and etudes will not be required for juries.

Evaluations from weekly lessons and studio classes will take place both mid-term and late second term before jury evaluations. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

#### Year 3 M3920

In consultation with the studio teacher, students must prepare 3 pieces of repertoire - at least one piece from the following list of required works (or similar-level substitution permitted by the instructor) and the others may be selected from standard clarinet solo repertoire. A work by an under-represented composer is strongly encouraged. All selected repertoire must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes.

Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations from weekly lessons and studio classes will take place both mid-term and late second term before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

#### Year 3 M3921

The required work and orchestral excerpts must be prepared for the December jury and amount to 10 minutes of music. A substitution for the required work may be used with the permission of the studio instructor. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries.

Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations from weekly lessons and studio classes will take place both mid-term and late second term. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

#### **Year 3** M3922

Three pieces, including one of the suggested required works from 3920 or an appropriate substitution at the discretion of the professor must be prepared for the jury with a total playing time not less than 20 minutes. A work by an under-represented composer is strongly encouraged.

Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations from weekly lessons and studio classes will take place mid-term and late second term before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark.

#### Year 4 M4925

Repertoire should be selected from standard clarinet literature in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. Two or three pieces should be selected to contrast in style and must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

### Year 4 M4924y, M4929

Repertoire should be selected from standard clarinet literature in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. All selected repertoire must amount to a total playing time not less than 30 minutes (for M4924y 15 minutes). Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Evaluations from weekly lessons and studio classes will take place mid-term and late second term before jury evaluations. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

#### Year 4 M4920

In consultation with the studio teacher, students must prepare 3 pieces of repertoire totaling 30 minutes of music - at least <u>one piece</u> from the following list of required works (or similar-level substitution permitted by instructor) and the others may be selected from standard clarinet solo literature. A work by an under-represented composer is strongly encouraged.

Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations from weekly lessons and studio classes will take place mid-term and late second term before jury evaluations. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

#### Year 4 M4921, M4922

The required work and orchestral excerpts must be prepared for a December jury, preparing 10 minutes of music. A substitution for the required work may be used with the permission

of the studio instructor. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries.

Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations from weekly lessons and studio classes will take place mid-term and late second term. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark.

Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations from weekly lessons and studio classes will take place both mid-term and late second term. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.
